	1. provide a table of a <u>minimum</u> of six (6) empirical articles for use in a meta-analysis. This meta-analysis must contain only empirical journal articles. The template for the table can be found on Blackboard and has been e-mailed to you
	2. provide a one-page summary analysis that supports a conclusion (supported by your empirical studies) for evidence-based practice. You may not exceed one page
	3. photocopies of all articles used in meta-analysis must be submitted in class or in my mailbox. Staple each article and bind with a binder clip. Include the cover/checklist sheet (required)
	- the title of the paper should clearly identify your assigned topic area.
Grading criteria:	Your assignment must answer your research question: What is the effectiveness of ?
	- APA format only and APA format must be applied rigorously (title page or running headings not necessary) or the assignment may lose points for failure to correctly apply APA format
	- internet sources will not be accepted (a line will be drawn through them and they will not be considered)
	- a <i>minimum</i> of six (6) references are required
	- the references must be empirical journal articles that support a conclusion in favor of or against evidence-based practice. Six qualified articles meets the criteria for a "C" grade
	- you <u>must</u> reach a clear conclusion about the effectiveness of the topic/intervention that was selected for you
	- references must be related to your assigned topic
Late submissions:	- not recommended
